What You Need for Training Class

- You must be pre- registered to take a class. To pre-register, call the office at (707) 253-8666. Once you are signed up through the office, visit nvdtc.org/registering-for-classes/ for instructions on completing your registration. If registration is closed for the current session, check our year-round session schedule at-nvdtc.org/pdfs/NVDTCTrainingSchedule.pdf for date registration opens for the next session.
- A copy of your dog's current vaccination records* must have been provided to the dog club along with your payment, and filled out registration documents (training application and questionnaire) by the payment deadline as shown on our year-round session schedule: nvdtc.org/pdfs/NVDTCTrainingSchedule.pdf/.
- Payment is by check. PayPal and credit card payments are not available at this time. Payment along with registration documents and shot records must be received by NVDTC by the payment deadline as shown on our year-round session schedule nvdtc.org/pdfs/NVDTCTrainingSchedule.pdf/ by mailing to Napa Valley Dog Training Club, 68 Coombs Street #7, Napa CA 94559 or placed in an envelope with your name on it and deposited in the club's drop box located outside next to the entrance to the Napa Valley Dog Training Club (located at 68 Coombs Street, Building N in Napa. If payment and paperwork are not received on time, your spot will be given to someone on our waitlist.

 - *All dogs enrolled in our Puppy, Adolescent and Good Manners classes must have proof of vaccination before entering the club's training facility. Dogs in puppy classes must have at least 2 DHPP shots 3 weeks apart.

Bring to Class Each Week for your DOG:

- <u>6' leather or nylon lead (leash)</u>. If you use a flexilead (retractable leash) at home, please switch your pet over to the more sturdy lead before entering the training facility.
- Flat buckle or quick release collar. If you feel your dog would do well with a special training collar or harness – please speak with the instructor.
- <u>Light-weight bed</u>, <u>blanket or towel</u> for use in class. (Something that is easy to carry and wash.)
- Lots-n-lots of small, soft treats that your dog can easily eat and enjoys. Try to pack 3 or 4 different kinds of goodies to help your dog be successful.
- A bait bag or similar small, cloth pouch for the dog's training treats. This is something you can get your hand in-and-out of easily and quickly.
- Water and water bowl for your dog.
- · Plastic bags for dog waste.

Bring to Class Each Week for YOU:

- Wear comfortable clothing and closed-toed, closed-heeled shoes during training sessions for safety purposes. Tennis shoes are recommended; sandals and clogs are not appropriate for training sessions. Our training facility is located in a warehouse, so please dress appropriately for weather.
- Bottle of water, if you need it.
- · Plastic gloves, if you wish.
