
OPEN HOUSE AT THE CLUB SATURDAY, JULY 14th 1 TO 4 PM


Thank you from Tiffany to Donna

I really want to thank you for everything you do in our scent work class. With my Ruger being a reactive dog, it has always been a challenge finding things that he can do and be confident while doing so. He really loves attending class and gets extremely excited when he sees me getting everything together to leave for class. He enjoys his obedience class but the enthusiasm he displays for obedience class isn't anywhere near how excited he is when he knows we are going to nose work.

Since taking your class I've noticed his confidence in new locations is slowly getting better.

Ruger is learning new places can be rewarding as opposed to being scary. I feel it's also helping me learn to trust my dog more and be a better handler for him. Since taking class and trusting him on a long line and allowing him to go further than normal, I'm seeing the lack of reactivity while searching. This is resulting in less leash reactivity. We're finding our balance and working better as a team. Not saying that we weren't close or bonded before, but this has definitely made us a better team. I appreciate all the work you are doing with us more than I could explain.

What is a scent work class? Your dog learns to find essential oils, birch, anise and clove, just like dogs trained to find drugs. With

scent work, dogs are always rewarded when they find the odor. This is a class for dogs of all ages and all sizes. No other training is needed. However each dog has to remain in the car until it is their turn. Each dog will have 3 or 4 turns per class. If your dog has issues with other dogs, this is not a concern as only

one dog works at a time. However dogs cannot be people aggressive. Class duration is 60 minutes to 90 minutes. This is not a one session class but a continueing class. For more information email me at donnagk9@gmail.com/.

 - 2. There is a shortage of assistants, typical at this time of year.


