

She received her certification in pet training from the Petsmart Pet Training Academy and graduated from the Marin Humane Society Canine Behavior Academy I and II. Sara is a professional member of the Association of Pet Dog Trainers and is a certified Canine Good Citizen evaluator with the American Kennel Club.

Sara has extensive experience with pit bulls and has fostered over a dozen in her home. From 2006-2010,



Sara served as lead dog trainer for BAD RAP's (Bay Area Dog Lovers Responsible About Pitbulls') adoption and education pro-

grams, Pit Bull Hall and The Ambassadog Project. Sara has been teaching group dog training classes for over ten years and has taught for the Oakland SPCA, San Francisco SPCA and Tony La Russa's Animal Rescue Foundation.

Sara completed the coursework for the K9 Nose Work instructor program with the National Association of Canine Scent Work and has taught nose work classes for several years in the Bay Area. Sara's students are highly successful in competition and have earned titles all the way up to the NW3 title level.

Sara's other dogs include Leroy, CGC, a rescued pit bull who survived Hurricane Katrina and Finntroll du Loups du Soleil, a Belgian Malinois. She is currently training Finntroll in the obedience, agility and protection elements required for French Ring Sport and Mondioring Sport competitions.






### Would you like to see a pencil drawing of your dog?

- 3. Alright, the dog is allowed in all rooms, but has to stay off the furniture.
- 4. Well, okay, the dog can get on the OLD furniture only.
- 5. Fine, the dog is allowed on all the furniture, but is not allowed to sleep on the bed.
- 6. Okay, the dog is allowed on the bed, but only by invitation.
- 7. The dog can sleep on the bed anytime, but not under the covers.
- 8. Okay, the dog can sleep under the covers, but by invitation only.
- 9. Fine, the dog can sleep under the covers every night.
- 10. Humans must ask permission to sleep under the covers with the dog.

### Change to Membership Application

To continue to grow our club in a positive and forthright matter, the Board is proposing the following code of conduct be added to the NVDTC membership application. Note this is a working draft and will be presented

### PROPOSED

Napa Valley Dog Training Club Code of Conduct

The Napa Valley Dog Training Club (NVDTC) is a community-based organization dedicated to promoting the training of dogs, and cooperation and good sportsmanship among its members. Members participating in this organization are subject to its bylaws, guidelines, policies and procedures. Any member, who violates these regulations and/or this Code of Conduct, is subject to discipline, up to and including termination of membership.

This Code of Conduct is based on the Golden Rule.

- Members shall participate in club activities and classes while upholding the safety of their pet and others at all times.
- Members shall treat all pet owners and their dogs in a responsible and professional manner, regardless of owner's ability or dog's breed.
- Members shall maintain a spirit of cooperation toward other members, class participants, the NVDTC and outside organizations, groups and clubs.
- Members shall respect the training and behavior goals of others.
- Members shall be respectful of colleagues and other professionals and not judge or falsely condemn their character or professional acts.
- Members shall respect the privacy of other members and class participants, and shall use discretion in revealing information regarding dogs displaying potentially dangerous behavior.
- Members shall refrain from criticizing, or publicly denigrating the conduct or opinions of other members or class participants in public or to outside parties.

The Napa Valley Dog Training Club will provide appropriate and clear avenues through which complaints may be lodged and resolved. This system will be available to all parties and will enable the NVDTC to appropriately and equitably resolve all issues and complaints.

This Code of Conduct will be reviewed when necessary. Submissions for changes to the Code may be made by any member, in writing, to the Board of Directors. Changes will be voted upon at an Annual General Meeting.
