Suzie started her journey working with fear-based and reactive dogs because the dogs in her life exhibited these characteristics. After hiring several trainers who did not provide her with the skills needed to help her dogs, Suzie attended the Canine Consultant/Instructor Training Academy (aka Canine Behavior Academy) at the Marin Humane Society.

After attending the academy, Suzie gained the skills she needed to work with her dogs and wanted to share her skills to help others. She started off by volunteering at the Marin Humane Society working with the dogs in their care and within months was asked to join the training and behavior staff. There, she taught basic training classes,

Difficult Dog classes and provided consultation services to clients in need of assistance with their dogs.

Suzie continued her education attending seminars presented by industry leaders including Steve White, Ken Ramirez, Kay Laurence and Bob Bailey. Her time with Bob

helped her to develop a great appreciation for the skills required to break behaviors down to small components that allow the animal to succeed before stepping up the next component to achieve success. By applying

these skills, she was able to help a greater number of dogs achieve success resulting in improved relationships with their guardians and a reduction in dogs returned to shelters.

Videotaping to Enhance Your Training

The thought of bringing a video camera to my training sessions terrified me. I really didn't want to see the truth. I felt I was the least proficient team in our training group. Many of the group encouraged me to give up. But that is not who I am. My dog deserved better when it came to my belief in our team.




Whether you are a team that dabbles or competes in the sport of freestyle, rally, obedience, or agility, videotaping can become your best friend.

Did I mention I was terrified to see myself and my dog on video? I had to put my pride aside and choose to learn to become the best handler I could be, for the sake of my dog and my team.

Reluctantly, I decided to take my video camera to the training field. It turned out to be the best move I could have

First, I had to be able to visualize in my mind, my dog and myself performing the new skill correctly. How did I want it to look? Some skills were easier to imagine than others. Those skills that I couldn't picture in my mind, I turned to the internet to watch teams that had mastered that skill. What qualities stood out as I watched them perform. Was it the handler's gait? The air of confidence? The approach to the skill? What stood out as I watched masters perform that skill? Can I duplicate that in my own mind and body? This was the turning point for my team.

Once you can imagine it, you can start to shape it into reality. Look for those moments when an aspect of that skill or element actually happens. Watch for it! Believe in that vision!

How does this story end? Well, for me it's a continual learning challenge. For my rottweiler, Luc, his story was a success. One of the teams from my club had to enter the titling event that we were sponsoring. We went from the least prepared (remember, they told me to quit), to the team most prepared. So Luc and I were the team who represented our club in this trial.

We did put in many, many hours per week of training, but the biggest break through was being brave enough to watch that video of our training and notice that one skill that looked really good. Yes, it's possible!

This month, take one skill and dedicate your time to it. Picture it perfectly in your mind, as unrealistic as that may seem. Watch videos of others who have mastered that skill. Then watch your team emerge!




